GARDEN ROUTE

Along the south coast of South Africa lies one of the most beautiful stretches of coastline in the world, home to the Garden Route National Park. It falls across both the Eastern Cape and Western Cape and brings together a series of tourist facilities that include camping areas, chalets. hiking and mountain bike trails, forest trails, canoeing, diving and other local activities.







AUGRABIES

The Augrabies Falls National Park covers an area of 820 km² and stretches along the Orange River. It is very arid. The waterfall is about 60 metres high. The Khoi people called it "Aukoerebis", or place of Great Noise, as this powerful flow of water is unleashed from rocky surroundings characterised by the 18km abyss of the Orange River Gorge.

KRUGER

Kruger National Park is one of the largest game reserves in Africa. It covers an area of 19,485 square kilometres: 360 kilometres from north to south and 65 kilometres from east to west. Areas of the park were protected bv government of the South African Republic in 1898, and it became South Africa's first national park in 1926. The park has nine main gates allowing entrance to the different camps.

AGULHAS

The Agulhas National Park is a South African national park located in the Agulhas Plain in the Western Cape, about 200 kilometres southeast of Cape Town. The park stretches along the coastal plain between the towns of Gansbaai and Struisbaai, and includes the southern tip of Africa at Cape Agulhas where two oceans, the Indian and Atlantic, meet in tumultuous crash of waves.
