CRADLE OF HUMANKIND

Located 40 minutes away from Johannesburg, the Cradle Humankind World Heritage Site is one Gauteng province's of attractions. The Maropeng Visitor Centre & Sterkfontein Caves are the two prime sites to learn about the appearing of mankind and its evolution, a journey that began 4 billion years ago when the planet started shaping.

ROBBEN ISLAND

A former leper colony, mental hospital and a base for military training, Robben Island World Heritage Site is nowadays famous for having been the prison for antiapartheid activists, among them former President Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela. The "struggle university", as it was known, held captive some of the greatest leaders that conducted South Africa to democracy. Mandela spent there 18 of his 27 years in prison.

DRAKENSBERG

KwaZulu-Natal's 200km-long escarpment with peaks that exceed 3 000m (the Berg as it's more commonly known) forms the backbone of the Maloti-Drakensberg mountain range. Located between the Kingdom of Lesotho and South Africa, it is a biodiverse wonderland of river valleys, mountain streams, rugged cliffs, hiking trails and stunning scenery that attracts of tourists. mainly from thousands December to February.
