Kruger Park, Mpumalanga

This is by far South Africa's most well-known Park. With nearly 2 million hectares, it offers a fantastic biodiversity to visitors: 336 species of trees, 114 of reptiles, 507 of birds and 147 of mammals. Augrabies Falls, Northern Cape

The Augrabies Falls National Park is one of six South African national parks in the Northern Cape. It follows the course of the Orange River from just outside Kakamas to the Namibian border, spanning more than 800km². One of its biggest drawcards is the Orange River which thunders its way through the park cascading powerfully down the 56m Augrabies Falls.
