Durban is also the one-time home of one of India's most widely recognised figures – Mahatma Gandhi. Gandhi spent his formative years as a young attorney in Durban from 1893 to 1914. It was here that he developed his philosophy of 'Satyagraha,' a form of active yet peaceful resistance to political injustices.

FERNANDO PESSOA

Pessoa arrived in Durban as a 7 year old child accompanied by his mother and step father, the Portuguese Consul in Durban. It was here that he received his education and completed high school, all in English, until the end of the 19th century. In 1905, after finishing his Bachelor of Arts at the University of Cape Town, he departed to Lisbon never to return to South Africa. In 1987, the António de Almeida Foundation placed a statue of the poet in the corner of Pine and Gardiner Streets, in the center of Durban.
