DOORNKLOOF NATURE RESERVE

The reserve lies peacefully in the mountainous Karoo, outside the small town of Colesberg. The 9 388ha reserve, positioned at the top end of the southern shore of the Vanderkloof Dam – South Africa's second-largest water reservoir, boasts kudu, eland, brown hyena, reedbuck, steenbok, duiker and a myriad of bird species.
