

LIST OF DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR VISITOR'S VISAS EXCEEDING 90 DAYS

- Passport
- Copy of Passport (biometrics page)
- 1 updated color photo (not older than 6 months)
- Copy of previous visas to South Africa
- Form BI-811 – Medical Report
- Yellow Fever Certificate, if applicable
- Marriage Certificate / Divorce Decree / Affidavit of Spousal Relationship / Legal Separation, if applicable
- Police Clearance Certificate from each country where the applicant, after having attained the age of 18 years, has resided for 12 months or longer during the five years immediately preceding the date of application.
- Written Undertaking by SA Institution / SA citizen / Permanent Resident duly stamped or signed before the SA Police Service / SA Commissioner of Oaths accepting full responsibility: accommodation, medical expenses, and repatriation, should it become necessary.
- Certified copy of SA ID / Passport and valid visa of the Host.
- Air travel bookings (departure and return)
- Form DHA -1738
- Fee: € 50,00 (cash, exact amount)

Important notes:

- Incomplete applications are not accepted.
- All application forms must be fully filled in with a black ink pen, and legible handwriting.
- All details provided by the applicant should be in accordance with the documents produced (e.g. name and surname in accordance with passport details).
- All applicants are required to come to the Embassy themselves, and sign the previously filled in forms in the presence of an Embassy Official.
- All documents that are not in english must be translated.
- A Photo booth is available at the Embassy for international standard photographs. (4xphotos=5euros)
- All documents and letters must be signed and stamped
- The applicants must be portuguese citizens or holders of valid portuguese Residence Card issued by SEF Portuguese Authorities to apply at the SA Embassy in Lisbon.
- All documents in a foreign language must be translated into English.
- All documents issued by any country other than South Africa or Portugal must be certified by means of an Apostille or – if not party to the Hague Convention - by the Diplomatic representation in Portugal, duly accredited to the Portuguese Ministry of Foreign Affairs
