You don't need to be on a boat to watch them, because Hermanus, with its panoramic view to Walker Bay, is considered the best spot in the world to whale watching from land. These Southern Right whales often come close to the shore, sometimes within a few meters from the beach.

Table Mountain and Cape Town

Towering 1.086 m above Cape Town, this is the best reference for the city. This imposing mountain, flat on top like a table, is an absolute must to visit in the *mother city*. The visitor should be well aware of the weather conditions beforehand and seize the day in which it isn't covered by the towel (the cloud that surrounds it) to go up by the cable car so that he/she can enjoy a breathtaking view of the sea as well as of this beautiful city with Robben Island (Nelson Mandela's prison) at a distance.
