Panorama Route

The Panorama Route in the Mpumalanga Province, offers its visitors an array of absolutely breathtaking views. The *Blyde River Canyon* is the most striking example of such beauty and one of the biggest attractions in the region. The whole area is an extensive covering of subtropical vegetation, thus making it the world's largest green canyon.

The pituresque village of Graskop is the entrance to the Panorama Route. This is also a good suggestion to serve as a base to visit the region.

Lisbon Falls

No visit to the Mpumalanga Province is complete without visiting the beautiful waterfalls in the region. The *Lisbon Falls* are some of the most impressive. The locals state that the name may owe its origin to the country of the miners who arrived in the region towards the 19th century, following the discovery of gold in the proximity (Barbeton and Pilgrim's Rest). There's also a farm with the same name in the region (Lisbon farm).

Pilgrim's Rest is a jewel lost in time. Here one can go back in time and re-live the adventure surrounding the gold fever of the late 19th century in this region, which attracted people from Europe (Portuguese among them) and even from America: pioneers, miners, waiters and road robbers. Due to all this, it was declared a tourist attraction and National Monument in 1986. The Gold Panning Festival takes place every year in September and is another of Pilgrim's Rest's attractions, where the whole family can participate in searching for the precious metal.

Blyde River Protea

Proteas are South Africa's most emblematic flowers (King Protea being one of the country's symbols). These flowers are specificly endogenous to the Cape, namely the Western Cape Province. However, there is a variety which is endogenous to Mpumalanga, i.e. the *Protea Laetens*. Identified in 1970, this protea may be found in a small circumscribed area of about 100 km² in the vacinity of the Blyde River. As such, it received the name of Blyde River Protea.
