Robben Island, Western Cape

Robben Island is an absolute must-see attraction for every tourist to Cape Town. The 580ha ovalshaped island which was once a leper colony, later became home to the maximum security prison where Nelson Mandela, South Africa's first democratically elected President, spent many of his 27 years of imprisonment. Today, it is preserved as a National Monument and a World Heritage Site in memory of Nelson Mandela and the struggle against oppression. In the prisonturned-museum guides will take visitors around this living museum, and the informative talks have brought many a tourist to tears.
