Table Mountain and Cape Town

Towering 1.086 m above Cape Town, this is the best reference for the city. This imposing mountain, flat on top like a table, is an absolute must to visit in the *mother city*. The visitor should be well aware of the weather conditions beforehand and seize the day in which it isn't covered by the towel (the cloud that surrounds it) to go up by the cable car so that he/she can enjoy a breathtaking view of the sea as well as of this beautiful city with Robben Island (Nelson Mandela's prison) at a distance. Since 2012 it's one of the 7 Natural Wonders.

Betty's Bay, Kleinmond, Pringle Bay, Stanford or Gansbaai are some of the places where you can enjoy the humpback whales - some weighing more than 30 tons - but it is in Hermanus that the sighting tradition is the strongest, between June and October.
